The Daughters of the Nile Foundation met with officials of Shriners Hospitals for Children® for the purpose of distributing the interest income of the Convalescent Endowment Fund and the accumulated pool of money in the Convalescent Relief Account. A check in the amount of \$1,334,450 was given to Shriners Hospitals for Children® Chairman of

the Board, Imperial Sir Douglas Maxwell. In addition to this check, \$212,023.86 was given to Shriners Hospitals for Children® – Canada. Additional contributions from Daughters of the Nile include:

- \$184,504.92 from the Lillian Tucker Estate, Tab'itha Temple No. 135 designated for Shriners Hospitals for Children® — Tampa;

- \$2,500 from the Mary Willi Estate, Hatasu Temple No. 1 designated for Shriners Hospitals for Children®;
- \$15,000 from the Louis Fredrick Meyer Trust designated for Shriners Hospitals for Children® – Philadelphia.

Together, these contributions from Daughters of the Nile directly to Shriners Hospitals for Children® total **\$1,748,478.78**. Imperial Sir Maxwell thanked all Daughters of the Nile for their continued dedication, love and support of the special children cared for at Shriners Hospitals for Children®. "With all of us working together, I am optimistic about the future," said Maxwell.

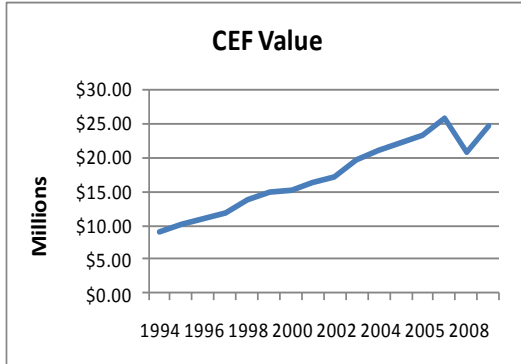
Convalescent Endowment Fund Rebounds After Market Slump

The Convalescent Endowment Fund has rebounded nicely after the woeful market performance of 2008–09. The CEF portfolio is up nearly 27% for the 12 months ending March 31, 2010. Investment Manager David Craft of Wells Fargo Wealth Management

Group told the Foundation Board of Directors, “Rest assured that your portfolio is holding up well during these wild days in the market.”

The value of the Convalescent Endowment Fund as of March 31, 2010 was \$24,927.064; this amount reflects the contribution of \$1,334,450 given to Shriners Hospitals for

Children® this year. While many Foundations and charitable entities suffered greatly during the recent economic depression, the investment strategies for the Daughters of the Nile Foundation Convalescent Endowment Fund have proven to be successful for the vision of helping children for many years into the future.



Directors Develop Strategic Plan

For 86 years, the Daughters of the Nile has provided financial support to Shriners Hospitals for Children®. Subordinate Temples and individuals have been dedicated in raising money through card parties, bean suppers, style shows, chicken dinners, raffles, and silent auctions; they have purchased Stepping Stones to Happiness certificates and contributed to the Convalescent Endowment Fund and Convalescent Relief Account. Thousands of children have benefitted from the hard work and generosity of the Daughters of the Nile in the United States and Canada. With the creation of the Canadian Trust in 1997 and the Daughters of the Nile Foundation in

2007, our organization has taken its philanthropic giving to the next level, increasing opportunities for helping children considerably. In the United States, the Foundation is now fully qualified under the IRS as a 501 (c)(3) nonprofit public charity, providing tax incentives for members and the public to help us help children. This strategic plan represents the first formal planning document of the Daughters of the Nile Foundation. Developed by the Board of Directors in 2010, this plan is a key component in determining the future direction of the Foundation, maximizing our ability to assist the special patients of Shriners Hospitals for Children®. Over the next five years, this

document will serve as a framework to guide us in achieving our vision of philanthropy and service to others. This “road map to success” will guide the actions and decisions of the Foundation Board of Directors as we partner with the Supreme Temple Board of Directors and Subordinate Temples in *Working Together for the Children*. Our commitment to achieving our vision and goals is, and will continue to be, unchallenged. This strategic plan will guide us in all our efforts to improve and sustain our philanthropic efforts. *Working Together*, we can make a difference! The top three goals identified are: increase the Convalescent En-

Corporate Donations Help Daughters of the Nile Support Children

Microsoft Corporation, based in Seattle, Washington has presented checks totaling \$20,245 to the Daughters of the Nile Foundation through its matching funds program. These contributions have been made to the Convalescent Endowment Fund in response to volunteer service hours by Past Supreme Queen Muriel Knapp during her time spent on the Supreme Temple elected line.

In 2006, when then Supreme Queen Billie W. Davis appointed a committee to investigate the feasibility of the Daughters of the Nile applying for classification by the Internal Revenue Service as a 501(c)(3) public

charity, one of the key considerations was eligibility to receive corporate donations. Corporations with charitable programs do not generally contribute to 501(c)(10) fraternal organizations, such as the Daughters of the Nile, as the tax benefits to the corporation are not nearly so great. When the Daughters of the Nile Foundation was granted public charity status by the IRS in 2007, the Foundation became eligible to receive corporate donations and matching gifts.

Members and friends of Daughters of the Nile are encouraged to check with their Human Resources Departments

about this method of contributing to the Convalescent Endowment Fund. As a 501(c)(3) nonprofit public charity, the Daughters of the Nile Foundation qualifies for matching funds. Some corporations will match dollar for dollar any contribution to our philanthropy. Some businesses, such as the Microsoft Corporation, will provide compensation for volunteer hours spent working for a public charity.

The Daughters of the Nile Foundation Board of Directors has sent an expression of appreciation to Microsoft for their generous contribution.

On September 28, Supreme Queen Vesta Marshall made her official visit to the Spokane Hospital of Shriners Hospitals for Children and dedicated a second Gold Plaque, representing over \$2

Million contributed by the Daughters of the Nile Foundation to this hospital.

Past Imperial Potentate Tad Claypool brought greetings from Imperial Sir Jack Jones and Hospital Administrator Gene Raynoud presented Supreme Queen Vesta with a philanthropic plaque commemorating the event. Tours of the hospital were provided for the visitors.

The Daughters of the Nile Foundation contributes over \$1 Million each year to Shriners

Hospitals for Children® through the Convalescent Endowment Fund and Convalescent Relief Account. The goal is to place two Gold Plaques in each of the 22 Shriners Hospitals for Children®. Currently, eleven hospitals have two Gold Plaques for the Daughters of the Nile, and Shriners Hospitals for Children® – Canada has a third Gold Plaque.

Shriners Hospitals for Children® – Canada Receives Third Gold Plaque from Daughters of the Nile

On July 18, Supreme Queen Vesta Marshall visited the Shriners Hospitals for Children® –Canada in Montreal to present a third Gold Plaque representing \$3 Million given to this hospital. The donation was presented on behalf of the 2,900 members from the 12 Canadian Temples of the Daughters of the Nile.

The previous plaques were placed in 1995 by Past Supreme Queen Rhona Kerr of Oronto Temple No. 69 in Toronto and in 2002 by Past Supreme Queen Nancelyn Ross of Sphinx Temple No. 116 in Winnipeg.

Daughters of the Nile contributions have helped fund projects

such as the Bone Anchored Hearing Aid (BAHA) program led by Dr. Lucie Lessard. Thanks to this technology and expertise, more than 70 profoundly deaf children have been able to hear. The Daughters of the Nile also provides vital funding for the purchase of hundreds of prostheses and orthosis annually for hospital patients.

Gary Morrison, chairman of the board of governors of Shriners Hospitals for Children–Canada told the crowd, “On behalf of our young patients and our staff, I wish to thank the Daughters of the Nile. In addition to the

extraordinary gift they are making today, they are contributing to improve the quality of care and quality of life of the children and their families, as well as addressing the day-to-day needs of the children by providing arts and crafts materials and games for our child life department.”

dowment Fund by 10 percent annually; educate Subordinate Temples, and increase public awareness. Since its creation in 1949, the Convalescent Endowment Fund has been the nucleus from which contributions to Shriners Hospitals for Children® are made. The CEF is a permanent trust with the interest income given annually to benefit the special children. The Endowment Fund

has grown from \$5.3 million in 1989 to over \$26 million in 2010 with annual contributions exceeding \$1 million for several years. Donations to the CEF have enabled Daughters of the Nile to contribute over \$46.9 million to Shriners Hospitals for Children®; but we can do more! Through educational programs in the Subordinate Temples, promotional correspondence to all members, and telling our story to the public, the Conva-

lescent Endowment Fund can continue to grow in perpetuity. The Foundation's status as a public charity provides opportunities to share the story of our support and seek contributions from outside our membership as well as from the members of Daughters of the Nile. The facts are clear: the larger our Endowment Fund, the larger our contributions to Shriners Hospitals for Children®
